## Railway Worker Injured In Fall From Ladder

Record FELA Award In Jackson County

## \$2.5 Million Verdict

Lorenz Hamm,
43, was a machine
operator for
Burlington
Northern & Santa
Fe Railway
Company. He sued
under the Federal
Employee Liability
Act after a fall
from a ladder.

Hamm operated a ballast regulator, a machine with a cab that rides on the rails. In December 1998, he was climbing down a ladder from the cab and struck his foot on a metal brace. He sprained his ankle, fell to the ground 6 feet below and landed

on his tailbone. Hamm was later diagnosed with torn disks.

Burlington Northern did not manufacture the machine but had completely rebuilt it and redesigned the ladders as part of a reconditioning — even though Burlington Northern's internal rulebook prohibited changing the design of a machine without consulting the manufacturer. Burlington Northern admitted it violated the rule.

The new design of the ladder added the metal brace that Hamm struck his foot on, causing his fall. Several railway managers admitted the ladder brace was a tripping hazard.

Hamm underwent unsuccessful surgery on his back, followed by a pain management program to help him cope with chronic low back pain.

The \$2.5 million verdict is believed to be a record FELA award in Jackson County.
